Mr Day took some time assessing the female classes and commented on their structural correctness before selecting Meta Park Dexia as his champion Square Meaters Female. Mr Day commended this young March drop 2008 heifer calf for her hip to pin setup, her length and balance and that she shown plenty of thickness to complement her feminin looks.

The bull classes also shown high quality and after a long wait deciding on Chevy Farm and Kilayr Bulls. Judge Day then crowned Chevy Farm Dynamic the May 2008 Drop Bull as his Champion Square Meaters Bull and later sashed the bull as the Grand Champion Square Meaters for the Wagin 2009.

Mr Day said Dynamic was a superior bull, he had a strong sirey outlook, excellent feet and

legs on him and was great through out the front end. He was a complete package and a terrific example of the breed, he said.

Later in the interbreed progeny group, a second judge Lew Smit (WA) was impressed in the three heifers from Meta Park, he commented on their evenness and correctness of the heifers and their muscling. What he was really saying that they came a close second in a class of 16 progeny groups. Well done to Vince & Maureen Giglia. By Friday evening judging was completed and a BBQ Dinner was put on and a warm atmosphere was shared by all the cattle exhibitors.
